Year 2024 was filled with many wins, excitement, achievements and beautiful memories. We started with eight weeks of free Winter indoor foots skill training for ages 5-18 boys and girls. We served over one hundred participants per session. We then moved outdoor for the sixteen weeks of practices and league games for spring. We registered nine teams with the Ohio Travel Soccer League (OHTSL).

Our high school team was the division

champion. The spring session was followed by the four weeks of free Summer Soccer Camps which were held in four different locations around the city. We were able to have over 400 boys and girls participants. Our fall program consisted of sixteen weeks of practices and league games. Our U11-Boys were the division champions. In 2024 we offered two successful tournaments, The Inaugural Akron Spring Friendly Tournament and the 10th Annual Akron Unity Soccer Tournament.

It is with great joy to announce that one of our players, Delih Sowa was rostered on U14-Boys, Columbus Crew Youth Academy 2024. Three more of our players are in the final ten week evaluation period. Provided they made it through, it is an opportunity that could open doors to scholarships at Division 1, colleges or universities or to any professional soccer club here at home or abroad. The Columbus Crew is a member of the professional Major League Soccer (MLS)in USA.

I thank God for our players, parents, coaches and community supporters for the success of our program. Together we will build a stronger community.





Parent Corner – Wilmot Sowa Akron Inner City Soccer Club (AICSC) – A Springboard to Success

Akron Inner City Soccer Club (AICSC) is a springboard to success. To put things in perspective, let's meet this young man, a product of this distinguished soccer club that has served as a springboard to his promising soccer career. Hi, my name is Wilmot Sowa, and I have the pleasure of introducing you to my son, Dileh Owen Sowa, a true soccer phenomenon in the making.

Dileh, born on September 2nd, 2011, at the Akron General Hospital, started his soccer career in August 2016 at AICSC. AICSC, which has been around since 1999, is a family-oriented, child-focused, non-profit soccer club that provides fun activities geared towards soccer skills development at an affordable cost for Akron inner city youths and any other child wanting to participate.

The President, Coach Dele Olabisi, has been nothing short of amazing and welcoming of every child he crosses paths with, giving back to the community everything he could to help give these kids a brighter future. Dileh is a testament to Coach Dele and the entire AICSC's commitment, sacrifice, and hard work in the Akron community and its surroundings.

Dileh, like many other kids, started playing at age 5. At that age, the kids are mostly fascinated with the idea of just kicking the ball and hopefully scoring a goal. Winning was never a priority; they

simply just wanted to get out and run or play soccer, the fastest-growing youth sport in America. It was up to the AICSC coaches and staff to train and guide them in the right direction which they did passionately. As his dad and one of the soccer coaches at AICSC, I've been privileged to watch him grow and develop as a soccer player over time.

I clearly remember those early years when he roamed about the field and played out of position, those annual summer soccer camps that didn't just teach soccer fundamentals but also provided educative study materials, those long and tiring practice nights, and those dreadful games of reckless fowls and painful injuries, coupled up with bad officiating leading to a loss. In the middle of it all, It is amazing to see that the experience only increased Dileh's love for the game.

By age 10, playing both as a striker and a winger, he significantly helped his team (AICSC U11-U13) become a top contender all those years of competition in the Greater Akron Amateur Soccer Association (GAASA) and Ohio Travel Soccer League (OHTSL), scoring the most goals and finishing as champions in 2021-2022 season. Also, the team became champions back-to-back years of the Mike Good Memorial tournaments (2021, 2022).

May I also add that Dileh is one of the top performing 7th graders at his school (Beulah Park Middle School) maintaining a GPA of 3.7 and making the honor roll.





In 2023, Dileh and his family relocated to Columbus, Ohio, the epicenter of soccer in Ohio. That same year, he played for two different clubs, Columbus United (CU), competing at the National Premier League (NPL), and Club Ohio (CO) competing at the Elite Club National Leagues Regional (ECNL -RL). His exceptional performances on both Clubs certainly did not go unnoticed as the Columbus Crew professional club came knocking the following year.

In the Fall of 2024, he was invited to join the Columbus Crew U14 team where he continues to work hard on his craft in pursuit of his dream – becoming a professional soccer player. Dileh is forever grateful to all who in one way or another have contributed and will contribute to his soccer career, especially his parents who are his number 1 cheerleaders, AICSC, where it all started, The Crew, where the future lies, and most importantly, God, through His son our Lord Jesus Christ, without whom none of this is possible.





All the praise and honor belong to Almighty God, His kindness and goodness towards the soccer club shines brighter each day. Thank You Lord with a grateful heart.

THEN: The club was in August in 1999 with three coaches including myself and thirty three boys and girls. The goal back then and continues to be, providing a community based soccer open to families at an affordable cost in a safe environment. It was also hoped to be a detriment to negative behavior and influence. Our first practice was at Schneider Park on the West side of Akron. We joined The Greater Akron Amateur Soccer Association {GAASA} and played competitive games until spring of 2022.

NOW: In addition to our original goal, the program now has a van and a driver to help players needing rides to practices and games. We have partnered with different community organizations such as the Summit County


Public Library that provides books to summer camp attendance. We work with Summit Education Initiative (SEI) that provides up-to-date academic records of our participants and allows us to monitor their grades and attendance, which allows a coach to speak to any plyer having an issue in either area. The goal is to encourage the high school players to graduate on time and be college or Creer ready. Some of the formal players are now coaches and assistance coaches for the club.

The city of Akron has designated and maintains Lane Field as our practice field and the Copley Road Soccer Field is our home field for games. In 2022 GAASA merged with The Ohio Travel Soccer League (OHTSL) and we became a member. This league provides us with more competitive games.

One can see the reason for the 25 years anniversary celebration of the Akron Inner City Club on Saturday, September 14, 2024.
